President's Report – 2021/22

It is incredible to reflect on how much the landscape has changed since early summer. It is really pleasing to see how all members pulled together, even with the adversities thrown at us including the ever-present COVID, making 2021/2022 an enjoyable and extraordinarily successful season.

Our patrolling numbers stayed strong even with COVID restrictions in place and all patrols had a very eventful season with tsunamis, terrible weather, and some huge surf. The large surf over the holiday period resulted in an increase in rescues both at Toowoon Bay and at Blue Bay. SLSCC worked with Clubs to produce an information leaflet to be handed out to local tourist parks and shops detailing some of the potential hazards at our nearby unpatrolled beaches/popular swimming spots (Blue Bay and North Shelly). With this in mind, there were 30 rescues performed by TBSLSC volunteer lifesavers and I thank everyone involved as the outcome of each rescue was positive. The Club's **CORE BUSINESS** of **SURF LIFE SAVING** again thrived thorough the season. Thank you to all our patrolling members for your hard work and dedication in providing 6147 hours volunteering your time to keeping the beach going public safe.

The pandemic again caused uncertainty regarding member and community safety, however we were fortunate to have good retention of patrolling members and Nipper Families, with a large intake of new Nipper families. Our nipper numbers again exceeded expectations. In total TBSLSC had 737 members in 2021/22.

Our trainers, assessors and facilitators managed to deliver COVID safe courses and candidates competently completed these courses:

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques 4 candidates
Bronze Medallion 18 candidates
IRB Crew 6 candidates
Surf Rescue Certificate 14 candidates

We welcomed the new bronze members to patrols, increasing the strength of our patrolling teams. Credit must go to our Chief Training officer Sue Hale for all her efforts in her administration and organisation of these COVID safe courses ensuring the needs of SLSNSW, SLSCC, TAF's and candidates were met. Thanks must also go to our trainers, assessors and facilitators and SME's for your dedication to delivering outstanding training, assessing and facilitating which produces qualified, confident and adept lifesavers.

Our two nipper programs were again a huge success and I thank Lyn Waters (mainstream) and Karen Hickmott (Stingrays – for children with additional needs) for coordinating these. COVID again delayed the start of the season and it was decided that competition would not be actively promoted. COVID restricted local junior carnivals went ahead, and we had a small group of Nippers represent. Stingrays had another great year, although the weather gods were not kind! A group of Stingrays attended the Branch Inclusive Championships where they had an inspiring day. One brave Stingray registered for SLSNSW Inclusive Championships and was looking forward to the event, unfortunately it had to be cancelled due to a gastro outbreak.

Our Masters competitors attended some local and nearby carnivals with some good results. Number one team at SLSCC Branch Championships. State was unfortunately cancelled but they shone at Aussies 2022 on the QLD Gold Coast. Our Masters team came 12th (before boats points were included in the overall pointscore) in Australia out of the many clubs participating, and 1st out of the Central Coast clubs. Our Masters are a great bunch of athletes, excellent role models to us all, humble, and a group we should all be enormously proud of.

The Executive Committee has been extremely active during the last 12 months, details of which follows:

<u>CONSTITUTION</u> — A Constitution Committee was convened with the purpose of realigning the club's constitution with the Charities Act. The new constitution was approved by the membership at a special general meeting, it has been registered with Fair Trading and can be viewed at the Toowoon Bay SLSC website

<u>HEAD LEASE</u> - Our head lease with Central Coast Council (CCC) expired on 30th June 2022 and an application was made to continue the current lease in late February 2022. CCC wants to bring all surf clubs under a generic lease, and this may not happen for a number of years. The application has been lodged for a further 10 years under the current lease conditions and CCC has approved this in principle. Negotiations are underway with CCC to determine and clarify the Club's overall footprint.

<u>CARETAKER</u> – Our new caretaker Leigh Perrow has been in residence since March 2022 and has been completing duties around the club. If you have anything you see that needs his attention, let Jacqui in the office know or he is usually around on weekends.

<u>CAFE</u> – The Executive Committee made the decision earlier in the year to licence out the Café to a professional operator. After a lengthy EOI and interview process Carver Catering Pty Ltd was chosen as the new operator and Village Kiosk Toowoon Bay opened on Monday 20th June 2022. I've heard nothing but rave reviews. Come down and sample their coffee and tasty treats. Follow <u>Village Kiosk Toowoon Bay</u> on Facebook (@VillageKiosk) and Instagram (@villagekiosk) for daily updates.









<u>WEB PAGE</u> – Around mid-2020 it became apparent that the old website had been hacked and needed to be removed. With the help of Jordan at <u>Little Dog Design</u>, the new <u>Toowoon Bay SLSC website</u> was rebuilt from scratch. This was quite a task which was completed (90% there) for the beginning of the 2021/22 season. Modifications and updates are ongoing but overall, it's a very informative resource. If you have any feedback, please use the 'Contact Us' tab, top right hand of the screen.

<u>INVESTMENT</u> – The Executive Committee made the decision to explore some investment options to secure the financial future of the Club. This was carried out in consultation with club sponsor and patrolling member Stuart Mangion of <u>Fawkes Financial Services</u>. We'd like to thank Stuart for his advice and generous support.

<u>LIFESAVING EQUIPMENT</u> — We received delivery of a new IRB which will be ready for the new season. We also purchased a new motor with proceeds of the 2021/22 Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF). We have also been gifted another motor from SLSCC. Two IRB hulls and two motors were sold recently to a private buyer.

<u>SUNDAY SIPS</u> – Sunday SIPS has turned out to be a tremendous success and the featured bands every second Sunday of the month has proved an extraordinarily worthwhile income stream for the Club. Negotiations are still underway for beer/soft drink supply from Schweppes and new wines have been sourced from Bidfood. My thanks to all the SIPS volunteers for their continued support in giving up their time on Sunday afternoons and public holidays.

<u>BUILDING UPGRADES</u> — The external and internal lighting in the hall area has now been completely upgraded with plans underway to upgrade the lighting in the hallway, stairwell, kitchen, uniform room and shed. The Uniform Room/Training Equipment Room has undergone a complete facelift with new flooring thanks to our sponsor <u>Choices Flooring Tuggerah</u>, a coat of paint and new shelving. The new shelving has made organisation of the training equipment/manikins much easier and tidier. The uniform stock is now easily accessible, and club historical records and financial records are now all neatly stored in this room. CCC has agreed to replacing the tiles on the veranda and

I am still in negotiations with them to get a start date. Some of the tiles are cracked, missing or lose and this poses a safety issue. Renovating the tiling will only add to the appeal of the hall area. The shed roller door was replaced thanks to CCC. Remedial works on the roof carried out last year saved us from any significant damage through the recent weather events. Unfortunately, the caretaker's residence sustained some damage in that last east coast low and CCC were proactive in sending out a repairman as soon as they learned of the damage. A further grant is being sourced for more renovations and painting works to be carried out in the hallway, stair well, members toilets and office.

<u>ANZAC DAY 2022</u> – Following on from the success of the 2021 ANZAC Day service on the beach, Mick Cook coordinated another successful dawn ceremony with over 250 people in attendance.

BOARDS/PADDLES – The Club received a grant from Wyong Rugby League Club Group and a COVID Sport Recovery Grant which enabled the purchase of three new racing mals, three new adjustable ski paddles and 13 body boards.

TBSLSC must acknowledge our club sponsors and supporters who continue to provide ongoing support which allows us to continue and free up funds to purchase quality lifesaving equipment and provide education to our lifesavers and our Nippers – our emerging lifesavers. Magic Mums Cleaning Central Coast continue to provide a fantastic service in keeping our members' change rooms and first aid room clean and COVID safe, Central Coast Council for providing its Beach Safety Operations Fund to all Central Coast Clubs. Please join me in thanking Poseidon Pool Services, Robbo's Automotive and Tyrepower, and Zest Events for their continued support. We are very fortunate to have the pro bono support of Aubrey Brown Lawyers, Fawkes Financial Services, Fortunity, Endeavour Marine, Choices Flooring and Little Dog Design. Our plumbing needs are now met by new sponsor Blocked Plumbing Services, who also supplied a new First Aid sun shelter. Thanks also to Jeff from Hornby Project Signage for updating our honour boards and he is working on new sponsor signs. Lastly, thanks to Robbie from Alba Creations for his support in carpentry projects that often come up throughout the club.

Thank you to the Executive Committee – Karen, Lyn, Mick, and Nicole for another eventful, productive year. Your support is invaluable. To our Chief Training Officer Sue and of course Jacqui in the Office, thank you for your valued overall support. I would also like to thank those senior members who have directly assisted and advised me during the season with their invaluable counsel.

Director of Finance Report – 2021/2022

Overall surplus for the year was \$40,961 down from \$109,483 in the previous year. This drop is largely due to a \$130k reduction in government COVID support packages but also an increase in the ability to and consequent revenue from hiring of the hall.

During the year we made a couple of investments into a new investment portfolio. This is being managed by our Club member and sponsor Stuart Mangion of <u>Fawkes Financial Services Pty Ltd</u>. Current market conditions mean that our portfolio has suffered a drop in value, but these losses have not been realised and rallying investment markets are seeing the position improve. It is under regular review and the current investment profile has recently been endorsed as appropriate for the expected market conditions.

One of our club members nominated us to be a part of a charitable platform 'Benevity' that facilitates corporate donations.

Grants



We are grateful to receive the ongoing support of the Wyong Rugby Leagues Club Group who provided us with a grant of \$8,800 for the purchase of replacement rescue boards and water safety craft.

During the off season, we applied to the Office of Sport under their Local Sports Defibrillator Grant Program to replace three defibrillators with new machines more appropriate for our aquatic environment. This program covers 50% of the costs of the machines, associated accessories and training.

We welcomed \$5,000 from the Federal Government Volunteers Grant Scheme which has been utilised to purchase a new BBQ, a speaker system for Nippers and a new fridge/freezer.

We received \$7,500 from the NSW Government COVID Business Hardship Grant Program, \$1,500 from the Small Business Fees and Charges Rebate and \$1,000 in a COVID Sport Recovery Grant which we used to purchase body boards for our nipper groups.

SLSNSW provided \$2,500 as part of their Club Sun Safety Grant which we used to purchase wide brimmed hats for our patrolling member and our nipper age managers along with some sunscreen.



This year the Australian Government generously provided additional funding through the Beach Safety Equipment Fund to offer \$15,000 to clubs and we were able to utilise this funding to cover the purchase of a new Laerdal Airway Management Trainer, a Mercury 2 stroke motor including accessories and Surf Club Kit, comms helmet, various FA Supplies and oxygen bottle refills, and various patrol equipment (binoculars, radio cases etc).

We received \$1,685.84 through the SLSNSW Club Lifesaving Equipment Grant (CLEG), which is proudly funded by the NSW Government. This grant allowed us to purchase a new

oxygen resuscitation bag, a loud hailer megaphone and an IRB fuel cell.

Our Stingray Nipper Program was lucky enough to receive additional resources through grants sourced by both our national and branch organisations. SLSA provided us with a Demon 45" Easy Rider Body Board through their 2021 Inclusive Beaches Equipment Grant, supported by their online learning supplier Etrainu and with thanks to their national partner DHL for providing the shipping. SLSCC provided a tent and we have just received two new foam rescue boards, two nipper boards and two sets of noise reducing headphones for our auditory sensitive nippers.



We are still waiting on feedback on our recent applications to the NSW Community Building Partnership Program for completion of various club refurbishment projects and an application to Central Coast Council for a collapsible hoist for our wheelchair bound visitors and members.

<u>Vice President Youth Services/JAC Report – 2021/2022</u>

It's very lucky that I have a sense of humour and am very resilient as 2021/2022 season proved to be very testing for everyone involved in Toowoon Bay Nippers! We were used to coping with COVID19 and had the necessary protocols in place so that we could eventually start, albeit later than normal, on November 7th 2021. The adults were well trained after the previous season and were accustomed to signing in with the QR code. Thank you Jacqui, for meeting them all at your table and letting the flow of nippers proceed smoothly. Luckily, there have been no problems from the adults when we requested to sight proof of vaccination.




